In this time, £200 would've been a lot more money than it is today. Edward Sherrier's act of kindness and generosity inspired Miss Beckett to create the challenge, to find out how much good £200 can do now. She decided to donate £30 of her own money to each year group to see the amazing ideas they had and donate any profits they made to the local community and charities of their choice.

Following our Parent Survey Data in 2022-2023, we have increased our offer for Enrichment Opportunities for Sherrier children before and after school as the data showed some of our parents felt that we needed to offer more after school clubs.
